Ohio Gulch Transfer Station / Recycle Center is now accepting Plastic Food and Beverage Containers / Household plastics number 1 through number 7 (no five gallon buckets or pesticide / oil contaminated containers) as well as rinsed aluminum foil (in with aluminum and tin cans).

RECYCLING FACTS

ALUMINUM RECYCLING

- 1) An aluminum can is recycled and back on grocery store shelves in as little of 60 days.
- 2) Recycling an aluminum can saves enough energy to run a TV for three hours.
- 3) Aluminum cans will last in our landfills for more than 500 years.
- 4) Over 80,000,000,000 aluminum cans are sold every year!
- 5) At one time aluminum was more valuable than gold.
- 6) There is no limit to the number of times an aluminum can can be recycled.

Thankfully, Americans have become so aware of the importance of recycling that aluminum cans now account for less than 1% of the total waste going to landfills. And, Ohio Gulch Transfer Station/Recycle Center is now accepting rinsed aluminum foil (in with aluminum and tin cans). Keep up the good work!



NEWSPAPER RECYCLING

- 1) 500,000 trees are cut down to produce all of the Sunday newspapers.
- 2) 75,000 trees would be saved if one single run of the Sunday paper is recycled.
- 3) 250,000,000 trees each year would be saved if all our newspaper is recycled

GLASS RECYCLING

- 1) It takes about 4,000 years for a glass bottle to decompose.
