TREE-CYCLING

gain this year, you can send your dying Christmas tree off for a new life as mulch. Clear Creek Disposal will have collection locations in Hailey at the Park-n-Ride Lot on the northwest corner of Bullion and River streets, and in Ketchum at the YMCA's north parking lot. Trees with all the decorations removed can be left at the Clear Creek Banner, starting the day after Christmas through January 15. Trees are taken to the Ohio Gulch Transfer Station where they are chipped, eventually and made available for use as mulch or composting.

Holiday RE-Giving

'Tis the season to give, or perhaps to re-give.

Generally speaking, making things (any things) takes materials and energy from the Earth, so the longer goods stay in use, the better for the environment. Re-gifting got mainstream treatment in a Seinfeld television show over a decade ago. Here are some re-gifting ideas:

BOOKS: Sharing a book that you have enjoyed is akin to sharing an experience. Select with the recipient in mind. Libraries often have a section for 'recycling' books at no, or little, cost.

TOYS & CLOTHING: These must be clean and in nearly new condition. Toys should be age appropriate, and clothing both size and style appropriate.

HOUSEWARES: A small piece of art or kitchen gadget might find new life in a friend's home.

To avoid turing your gift into a gag, don't gift an item to the original giver or gift something very personal, like signature jewelry. Also, make sure the gift is appropriate for the recipient. Lastly, put your effort into wrapping the re-gift, and making it look like a gift your care about.

The app enables people to connect with neighbors and local shops so that surplus food can be shared, not thrown away.


IT'S A WRAP!
